RESOLUTION TO APPROVE AN OBSOLETE PROPERTY REHABILITATION EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE APPLICATION

PA 146 OF 2000 AS AMENDED

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Council of the City of Marshall, held on June 21, 2021 at 7:00 PM.

PRESENT: Mayor Caron, Gates, Schwartz, Traver, Underhill, and Wolfersberger.

ABSENT: Rice.

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Wolfersberger, and supported by Gates.

Resolution 2021- 26 Approving Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Exemption Certificate Application for Schuler's Located at 115 South Eagle Street

WHEREAS, pursuant to PA 146 of 2000, as amended, the City of Marshall is a Qualified Local Governmental Unit eligible to establish one or more Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Districts (OPRA); and

WHEREAS, the City of Marshall legally established the Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District Schuler's Building Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District No. 1 on October 19, 2020, after a public hearing held on October 19, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the taxable value of the property proposed to be exempt plus the aggregate taxable value of property already exempt under Public Act 146 of 2000 and under Public Act 198 of 1974 (IFT's) does not exceed 5% of the total taxable value of the City of Marshall; and

WHEREAS, the application was approved at a public hearing as provided by section 4(2) of Public Act 146 of 2000, as amended, on June 21, 2021; and

WHEREAS, Schuler's is not delinquent in any taxes related to the facility; and

WHEREAS, the application is for obsolete property as defined in section 2(h) of Public Act 146 of 2000, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has provided answers to all required questions under the application instructions to the City of Marshall; and

WHEREAS, the City of Marshall requires that rehabilitation of the facility shall be completed by December 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the commencement of the rehabilitation of the facility did not occur before the establishment of the Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District; and

WHEREAS, the application relates to a rehabilitation program that when completed constitutes a rehabilitated facility within the meaning of Public Act 146 of 2000, as

amended, and that is situated within an Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District established in the City of Marshall eligible under Public Act 146 of 2000, as amended, to establish such a district; and

WHEREAS, completion of the rehabilitated facility is calculated to, and will at the time of issuance of the certificate, have the reasonable likelihood to create employment, revitalize urban areas, and increase the number of residents in the community in which the facility is situated; and

WHEREAS, the rehabilitation includes improvements aggregating 10% or more of the true cash value of the property at commencement of the rehabilitation as provided by section 2(I) of Public Act 146 of 2000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Marshall and hereby is granted an Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Exemption for the real property (2nd and 3rd floor of 115 South Eagle Street), excluding land, located in Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District Schuler's Building Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District No. 1 at 115 South Eagle Street for a period of 12 years, beginning December 31, 2021, and ending December 30, 2033, pursuant to the provisions of PA 146 of 2000, as amended.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT July 19, 2021 - CITY COUNCIL MEETING

SUBJECT: New Traffic Control Orders (110, 111, 112, 113, and 114)

BACKGROUND: As the City grows, as traffic concerns become known, or as needs change, the Traffic Engineer will make recommendations to the City Council for permanent traffic control orders. These orders are intended to promote safe motor vehicle travel, and enhance pedestrian safety.

TCO's 110, 111, 112, and 113: The South NIA is a mechanism for the City to promote residential growth in the Alwyn Downs neighborhood. This has led to the development of the Norfolk Homes housing project. This multi family unit will spur growth which will increase vehicle and pedestrian traffic volumes, as well as change current travel patterns, in the Circle Drive, Rose Street, and Oak Drive neighborhood. So far there has been an extension of Oak Drive and the addition of Rebecca Street (old Rebecca Street was just a small stub off Circle Drive. In review of information provided by Norfolk Development, there will be additional new roads added in area in the future. Currently there are no traffic control devices at Rebecca and Circle, Rebecca and Oak, and Rose and Oak. There is a Yield sign at Rose and Circle, based off of a 1973 TCO.

Based on a review of the area, and plans for future development, the Traffic Engineer is recommending the following:

A stop sign shall be placed at the southeast corner of Rebecca Street and Circle Drive intersection to direct northbound traffic on Rebecca Street to stop.

A stop sign shall be placed at the northwest corner of Rebecca Street and Oak Drive intersection to direct southbound traffic on Rebecca Street to stop.

A stop sign shall be placed at the northwest corner of Rose Street and Oak Drive intersection to direct southbound traffic on Rose Street to stop.

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A stop sign shall replace the yield sign at the southeast corner of the Rose Street and Circle Drive intersection to direct northbound traffic on Rose Street to stop.

TCO 114: For the budget year 2021/2022, City Council requested staff to reduce expenses in the general fund budget. One area that was explored was a reduction in School Crossing Guards. In review of Federal and State law on manned school crossings, one of the driving factors is student volume (typically over 40 students in 2 hours), and the availability of gaps in traffic to allow for safe crossing. While the crossing at North Marshall has never really met these criteria, it has been pedestrian crosswalk for many years. It was likely created when pedestrian traffic to schools was much more common. A review of the Marshall Avenue crossing found significantly less than 40 students use this crossing, and that there were sufficient gaps in traffic for crossing, based on standards. Further review found that by placing a stop sign on Marshall Avenue at Schuyler, all north/south traffic must come to a complete stop at the intersection, which would create significant safe gaps in traffic for students to cross, as well as to slow traffic down. The intersection is a three-way intersection, as opposed to four, which adding stop signs would further heighten safety at the crossing.

It should also be noted that it is a common occurrence for citizens in this neighborhood to call the Police Department and complain of speeding vehicles in their neighborhood. This is enhanced by the fact the road is a common throughway from the center of town to the suburban neighborhoods north of the City, as well as a primary road for access to the Marshall High School.

Based on a review of the area, and a desire to improve the safety of the pedestrian crossing, the Traffic Engineer is recommending the following:

Stop signs shall be placed at the southeast and northwest corners of North Marshall Avenue and Schuyler Street to direct traffic on North Marshall Avenue to stop. Although not part of this order, the Traffic Engineer will be working with the Street Department to add pavement markings, adjust current warning signs, and perhaps add lighting.

FISCAL EFECTS: The new orders will cause the purchase of 6 new signs. This cost will be absorbed within the local roads budget. Also, there will be some minor costs as the intersection is transformed from a School Crossing, to a standard pedestrian crossing. This will include pavement markings and sign relocation.

RECOMMENDATIONS: As the Lead Law Enforcement Officer for the City of Marshall and the City Traffic Engineer, it is the recommendation

that the Council consider to making permanent Marshall City Traffic Control Orders 110, 111, 112, 113, and 114.

ALTERNATIVES: As suggested by Council.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT JULY 19, 2021 - CITY COUNCIL MEETING

SUBJECT: Multiple Downtown Events.

EVENT DETAILS: Multiple community groups have requested the road closure of Michigan Avenue on August 28th, 2021. The events include the Oaklawn Hospitality Classic, the Downtown Retailers Bazaar and the Copper Athletic Clubs 3-year Open House Celebration. It should be noted that the Farmers Market will also be open on this date.

BACKGROUND: On 4/19/2021, City Council approved the road closure of Michigan Avenue (and several other streets) for Oaklawn Hospitals annual Hospitality race. This event is planned, and ready to proceed. The event will cause intermittent closure of the Big Block of Michigan Avenue between 9:00am and 11:20am. The event is planned, ran and promoted by the Oaklawn Hospital.

On 5/3/21, City Council approved the road closure of Michigan Avenue for the Downtown Retailers Bazaar for June 26, 2021 and July 30th, 2021. The group had proposed two other dates, May 29th, which was withdrawn completely, and August 28th, which was withdrawn for further consideration. The event is planned, ran and promoted by the retailer's group, with the assistance of MAEDA. Upon recent discussion with the Downtown Retailers group, they are again requesting approval for their event on August 28th, seeking the event from 11:00am to 4:00pm.

The Copper Athletic Club has requested permission to host a public celebration of their third-year anniversary. They are proposing the event be held on Saturday August 28th from Noon to 10:00pm. In addition to their food and beverage specials, they seek to host an event outside of their establishment, so they have a larger venue for activities. These activities include hot dog eating contest, a celebrity athlete autograph signing appearance, and a live band. These events will require a stage. Their food and beverages will all be served inside, but with the benefit of the social district, guests will be able to take their purchases out into their designated event area/social district area. The Copper has requested permission to host the event downtown on Michigan Avenue.

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NOTES: It should be noted the event(s) will be held within the community's 'Social District', and as such, will be open to all to consume alcohol in the event area as allowed under our social district rules.

After review of past City right of way events, the City is requesting a few parameters to this street closing.

- 1. Any signage, electrical connections, plumbing connections, mechanical connections, and open flame devices shall be approved in advance, and be in conformance with City of Marshall code.
- 2. That all current State of Michigan and Calhoun County Health Department restrictions and guidelines related to Covid-19 be adhered to in the event area.
- 3. The event sponsor is responsible for placing the barricades across the road at the start of the event, and to remove them from the road at the conclusion of the event. They must also turn the 'road closed ahead' signs to face the road prior to the event, and away from the road after the event.
- 4. The event sponsor is responsible for set up and removal of all tents, tables, chairs, fixtures, signs, etc.
- 5. The event sponsor is responsible for trash collection, and debris removal from the area, including the City sidewalk, right of ways and road.
- 6. All sidewalks on Michigan Avenue remain at all times in compliance with MDOT guidelines, allowing an unobstructed path for pedestrians within the center portion.

FISCAL EFFECTS: The event will incur costs for several City Departments (Police and Fire \$174.51- Planning), (City Administration-\$18 Filing), (Streets \$686.56- MDOT Permit, Scheduling, Barricade Placement, Detour Routes), and (City Attorney \$43.75- Liability Review). This is cost estimated at \$964.61 per event. These costs can either be waived by Council, or can be assessed to the event sponsor by the City Clerk prior to the event. Note: The fees were waived already for the Oaklawn event.

RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that City Council review the additional two Event Requests (Downtown Retailers and Copper Athletic Club) and required street closures as presented, and consider appropriate action. Any approvals would be contingent on if the health mandates and orders in effect at the time of the event allow for it.

It is also recommended that as the event will be on City roads, and on City owned property, a certificate of proof of liability coverage insurance with coverage amounts/requirements to be determined by the City Attorney, and with City of Marshall named as co-insured, be obtained from the event sponsor/organizer. Note: Oaklawn Hospital and Copper Athletic Club already have insurance policies in place for their events.

EVENT STREETS AFFECTED:

Both directions of Michigan Avenue from Eagle Street to Jefferson Street will be closed the entire event, plus an hour before and after to facilitate set-up and clean-up.

While open for traffic, the following streets will see a high increase in traffic during the entire event, as they will be detour routes for Michigan Avenue: 100 block of North and South Eagle Street, 100 Block North and South Jefferson Street, Madison Street from Jefferson Street to Eagle Street, and Green Street from Eagle Street to Jefferson Street.

<u>DETOUR DETAIL:</u> Both lanes of Michigan Avenue lanes will be closed from Eagle Street to Jefferson Street from 1000 hours until 1600 hours. Westbound Michigan Avenue will have a signed detour as follows: South on Grand Street to Green Street, East on Green Street to Jefferson Street, North on Jefferson Street to Michigan Avenue.

Eastbound Michigan Avenue will have a signed detour as follows: North on Jefferson Street to Madison Street, West on Madison Street to Eagle Street, North on Eagle Street to Michigan Avenue.

SUBJECT: American Rescue Plan Act Funding Approval

BACKGROUND: The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 provides funding to the City from the Federal government passed through the State of Michigan in the amount of \$728,912. ARPA requires the City to comply with several policies and procedures as outlined in the funding terms and conditions. Many of these items were addressed in April of 2021 when the Council adopted the City's grant policy. Staff will be reviewing and recommending updates to the City Council for the remaining policies prior to spending any of the funding. In addition, due to the restricted uses of this funding, staff will be providing a funding plan to Council that outlines acceptable uses of the ARPA funds.

This resolution is recommending to the City Council to accept the funding only and is not addressing the spending plan. No funds will be spent without the approval of the City Council. When the funding is received, they will be placed in a separate fund for transparency and ease of compliance. Staff will be bringing a budget amendment to the City Council at a future Council meeting.

RECOMMENDATION: The recommendation is for City Council to approve the acceptance of the Federal funding from the American Rescue Plan Act.

<u>FISCAL EFFECTS:</u> None at this time. Future fiscal effects include: 1) a funding plan to be approved; and 2) a budget amendment for the funding and the uses approved by the Council.
