Ave Bridge over Rice Creek

BACKGROUND: The City has contracted with ROWE Professional Engineering Services to submit a funding application to MDOT's Local Bridge Program. The proposed project is replacement of the South Marshall Avenue Bridge over Rice Creek. This bridge needed emergency repairs to the structure and railing in the summer of 2019 and requires permanent replacement to remain operational. ROWE designed a portion of the temporary repairs in 2019 which allowed them to be well positioned to complete the Bridge Program funding application.

ROWE has completed a replacement estimate totaling \$1,709,000. The city would be responsible for 5% (\$86,000) of construction costs and 100% of design and construction engineering fees, which are estimated at \$310,000. The total contribution from the city would be \$396,000. This Bridge Program application is for MDOT's fiscal year 2024.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended the City Council approve the attached resolution authorizing the application to the Local Bridge Program for the South Marshall Avenue Bridge over Rice Creek.

<u>FISCAL EFFECTS:</u> Funding for the City's portion of the project would need to be added to the Major Street Capital Improvement Plan for the 2023-2024 fiscal year during the next CIP planning period.

SUBJECT: Amendment of Ordinance 70.17- Animal Drawn Vehicles

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> In the approved code, there is a requirement on the shoeing of horses- <u>Section E,2: The animal shall be shod with nonmetallic shoes from April 1 to November 1 of each year. Animals may be shod with metallic shoes and borium from <u>November 1 to April 1 of each year.</u> The restrictions in the adopted ordinance have since raised some concerns in the horse and carriage community.</u>

After the approved code 70.17 was passed and published, local business owner Dennis McKeen (Marshall Carriage Company) became aware of it. He contacted the Police Department with his concerns. One in particular, McKeen educated the Police Department on the subject of shoeing horses. McKeen explained several concerns reference the horse shoeing to include:

It was learned that many horse owners do no shoe their horses at all. This is due to their preference for the horse to rely on its natural hoof, particularly if the horse is not used on pavement much, and if the horse is healthy and well cared for. He indicated that he is able to provide professionals to support this.

Of more concern to McKeen was the topic of non-metallic shoes, and the severe financial impact of them, as well as some wellness concerns for the animal. McKeen explained that non-metallic shoes are not as simple as a onetime shoeing until they need to be replaced. He explained these shoes must be replaced/removed weekly. He explained that the non-metallic shoes are glued onto the horse's hoof, not nailed. He stated that once attached, the horse can work with this shoe for about a week. The shoe then has to be scraped off, and the horse must be rested after the scraping for a week, so its hoof can heal. He indicated that so not only does the horse have to recover, but he cannot use the horse for a week.

McKeen stated that horseshoeing is a technical skill, so most horse owners have to pay someone to provide the service. He stated that if the City continues to require the shoes (in particular the non-metallic), he (and most other small operations like his) could not afford to operate in Marshall. He went on to say that the municipalities that require this are generally larger tourist towns who have the volume of service to covers the costs and down time.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Council set a public hearing for April 19, 2021 on the suggested amendment(s) to the City Ordinance Chapter 70, section 70.17.

FISCAL EFFECTS: There are no known significant fiscal effects.

ALTERNATIVES: As suggested by City Council.

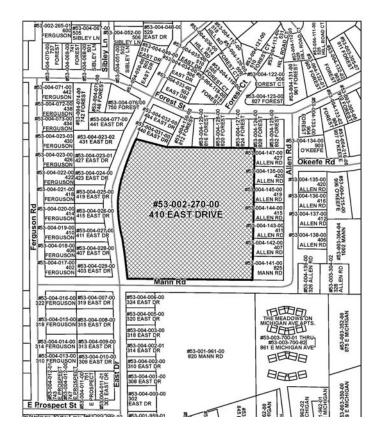

BACKGROUND: At the Special Council meeting on March 22nd, the Council established a public hearing for this meeting to hear comments on the adjustment to the Base Power Supply Cost in the Power Supply Cost Adjustment. At the meeting, John Courtney of Courtney & Associates presented the Revenue Requirements portion of the Cost-of-Service Study.

The State of Michigan Department of Treasury has requested a Deficit Elimination Plan for the Electric Fund. The proposed adjustment to the Power Supply Cost Adjustment from \$0.0650 to \$0.04636 will eliminate the deficit by June 30, 2023.

RECOMMENDATION: After hearing public comments, it is recommended that the Council approve the adjustment to the Power Supply Cost Adjustment.

FISCAL EFFECTS: The adjustment to the Power Supply Cost Adjustment will generate revenues to meet the requirements of the State Deficit Elimination Plan.

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Power Supply Cost Adjustment Applicable to City Electric Rate Schedules

Applicability

The Power Supply Cost Adjustment set forth herein shall apply to all of City's Electric Rate Schedules, except for the Monthly Security Light Rental Rate. The applicable adjustment shall be applied to the total kWh billed to customers for the meter reading period that City determines as most nearly corresponding to the meter reading period(s) set forth in City's purchased power billings from its supplier(s).

Base Power Supply Cost

The rates and charges set forth in City's Electric Rate Schedules are based on the cost of City's power supply requirements as furnished by Michigan South Central Power Agency (MSCPA). The Base Power Supply Cost included as City's Electric Rate Schedules is \$0.04636 \$0.065 per kWh

Monthly Determination of Power Supply Cost Adjustment

Each month City's Power Supply Cost Adjustment shall be determined as follows:

- A. The City's Running 6-Month Power Supply Cost per kWh shall be determined to
 - 4 decimal places by dividing (1) the sum of the past three (3)6 months' power supply cost, including the most recent months billing, by (2) the sum of the past 6three (3) months' net energy delivered to the City, including the most recent months billing.
- B. The Base Power Supply Cost of \$0.04636 \$0.065-per kWh shall then be subtracted from the

Running 6-Month Power Supply Cost per kWh determined in (a) above.

C. The Monthly Power Supply Cost Adjustment per kWh shall be determined by multiplying the positive differential derived in (b) by 1.08 to compensate for City's Distribution System Losses. If the differential derived in (b) is negative, the monthly power supply cost adjustment shall be \$0.000 per kWh.

SUBJECT: Electric Deficit Elimination Plan

BACKGROUND: The City is in the second year of a five-year deficit elimination plan with the State of Michigan Department of Treasury. On January 4, 2021, the City received notice that the State intended to withhold State Revenue-Sharing Payments unless a deficit elimination plan was submitted to remedy the deficit at the end of the five-year period. The State will continue to send this notice annually until the deficit is resolved.

The plan submitted and tabled by Council on March 15, 2021 has been revised to lower capital outlay needs and reduce the rate increase needed.

The plan outlined in the resolution shows years three through five for the Electric Fund with FY2021 showing the estimate for this fiscal year as well as projections from Courtney & Associates for the next two fiscal years. Please note this includes a rate increase needs to be approved by the City Council. The State will require the rate increase to be passed prior to the acceptance of the City's deficit elimination plan.

RECOMMENDATION: The recommendation is for City Council to approve deficit elimination plan for the Electric Fund and to direct the Finance Department to file the plan with the Michigan Department of Treasury.

SUBJECT: 2021 Street Improvements Phase #2

BACKGROUND: The residents of Marshall voted to approve a \$4.75 million Street Improvement Bond Proposal in November of 2020. City staff established a list of streets for improvement in summer and fall of 2020. Between now and the passing of the bond, the plan for each year of construction has been continuously reviewed and increasingly detailed. City staff propose to crush and shape 1.2 miles of street under the final street improvement project to be bid this Spring. This type of rehabilitation and the area proposed for the improvement are complicated and require more detailed plans above typical improved street mill and resurface projects. Additionally, the current focus of the engineering department is on construction projects that are underway. For these two reasons, City staff is requesting approval to utilize ROWE Professional Engineering Services to design and bid the rehabilitation work for the highlighted in YELLOW streets in the picture below.



ROWE has provided a proposal, attached to this report, for the amount of \$26,700 with a bid date of July 22, 2021 and anticipated project closeout of October 29, 2021. Per the City's updated purchase threshold, this project is under the amount that would require it to be publicly bid (\$27,500 for FY 2021). Furthermore, it is above the informal quote threshold requiring the City to obtain three (3) informal quotes. The Finance ordinance, 32.07 section B, allows an exception to the three informal quote process for the employment of engineering professional services with City Council's approval. The City has worked with ROWE on several road projects including the Monroe Street Bridge Replacement, Marshall Avenue Bridge Repairs, and semi-annual bridge inspections with success.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Council approve the ROWE Professional Services Proposal in the amount of \$26,700.

<u>FISCAL EFFECTS:</u> The approved amount will be expensed from the Street Millage Professional Services line item 204-441-801.00.

ROWE Professional Services Company is pleased to submit this professional engineering services proposal for the above referenced project. Our project understanding is based on our site visit meeting on March 3, 2021. We understand that the city has identified several roadways to be resurfaced in the southeastern city limits that will be funded through the current 2021 roadway millage. The project will generally consist of crushing and shaping the existing roadways, widening lane widths, providing supplemental aggregate as needed, limited drainage improvements, limited ADA ramp improvements, and hot mix asphalt resurfacing of local streets. ROWE has extensive experience working on projects of similar scope and size funded through a municipal road millage. The project locations are as follows and shown on the attached map:

- 1. Warren Street from S. Marshall Avenue to Cedar Street
- 2. Cedar Street from Warren Street to Montgomery Street

The Owner will designate a representative with the authority to provide direction, receive and review information, and make decisions regarding the project. Decisions and direction shall be provided in a timely manner, so as to not delay the project.

The Engineer will perform services in a timely manner, consistent with sound professional practice. The Engineer will strive to perform the services within the established schedule, if any. Services are considered to be complete when deliverables have been presented to the Owner.

The Owner will provide the Engineer with all available information pertinent to the site of the project and access to the project site.

The Engineer will assist the Owner in preparing applications and documents to secure approvals and permits. The Owner is responsible for payment of permit application fees and charges.

Services provided by the engineer shall be performed with the care and skill normally exercised by other members of the profession practicing under similar conditions.

The Owner shall promptly notify the Engineer of defects or suspected defects in the work.

The Engineer's opinions of construction costs will be based upon experience and historical information. The Engineer will be responsible for the safety precautions and programs of its employees only.

If the Engineer is reviewing work by contractors or others on behalf of the Owner, the Engineer may only recommend to the Owner that work which does not conform to the project requirements be rejected.

Payment for work completed shall be made within thirty days of invoicing. Unless otherwise provided, invoices will be submitted monthly as the work progresses.

In the event additional work is needed because of a change in scope or unforeseen conditions, the Engineer will submit a proposal defining the modified scope of work and any modifications to the schedule and fee for the Owner's approval.

This agreement may be terminated by either party with fourteen days written notice; however, the Engineer shall be paid for work completed prior to the date of termination.

All documents prepared by the Engineer in completing this work are considered the Engineer's property as instruments of service and are not intended for re-use by the Owner or others.

The Engineer is an independent contractor, responsible to the Owner for the results of this undertaking and is not an employee or agent of the Owner.

The Owner agrees to limit ROWE Professional Services Company's total liability to the Owner and any contractors on the project to \$26,700 or the Engineer's fee, whichever is greater.

The Owner and Engineer each bind themselves and any partners, successors, and assigns of the other party to this agreement. Neither party will assign, sublet, or transfer their interest in this agreement without the consent of the other party.

The terms of this agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Michigan. In the event a provision of this agreement is rendered unlawful, the remaining terms and provisions shall remain in effect.
