105 West Michigan Avenue CDBG application

BACKGROUND: Council approved the creation of an OPRA district in 2021 to assist in the redevelopment of the rear portion of the 2nd floor of 105 West Michigan Avenue for two (2) apartments. The next step in this project is the submission of a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) application for \$120,000 in assistance. This grant would be received by the City and passed through to Dr. Walker and Zettell to pay for the renovation, in addition to \$103,510 from Dr. Walker and Zettell.

To move this application forward, a public hearing needs to be scheduled to consider adoption of a resolution approving the application and authorizing the City Manager to serve as the Certifying Officer for the grant.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the City Council schedule a public hearing for January 18, 2022 to consider the submission of a CDBG application for the support of the 105 West Michigan Avenue project.

SUBJECT: Dial-A-Ride Transit Application for State and Federal Financial Assistance for State of Michigan Fiscal Year 2023.

BACKGROUND: As required by Michigan Public Act 51, Marshall Dial-A-Ride Transit (DART) must submit an annual application to the State of Michigan for financial assistance for transit operations and adopt a Resolution of Intent signifying the City of Marshall's desire to participate in the Comprehensive Transportation Fund (CTF).

The application submitted to the State of Michigan includes the following information:

- Proposed revenues and expenditures for fiscal year 2023, covering the period of October 1, 2022—September 30, 2023.
- Coordination Plan. This report lists other transit providers in the area and describes the efforts for coordinating transit services.
- Federal & State Certifications. Various certifications required as a condition of receiving Federal and State funding.
- Local Bus Capital Assistance. Includes an inventory of DART's current fleet and documentation of ADA accessibility. Marshall DART is requesting capital assistance funds in the 2023 application.
- Operational Data. This refers to projected ridership figures, as well as vehicle miles and hours of service.

For the 2023 State of Michigan fiscal year, Marshall Dial-A-Ride Transit has proposed a preliminary budget with funding sources of \$76,016 (18%) estimated Federal Section 5311 grant funds, \$147,748 (34.9854%) estimated State funds, \$249,513 estimated local funds (millage, local community stabilization share tax, fund balance to offset budget shortfall, and charitable donations), \$29,343 estimated fare revenues, and with total estimated eligible expenses of \$422,312 and estimated ineligible expenses of \$64,842 (\$64,725 for depreciation, \$117 Association Dues) for 2023..

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Council adopt the attached Resolution of Intent to authorize the City of Marshall to seek financial assistance from the State of Michigan for its public transportation service, DART.

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FISCAL EFFECTS: None at this time. This action pertains to just the submittal phase of the application process for Federal and State operating assistance in the amount of \$ 223,764, but it is not the final contract for these funds.

SUBJECT: Stump Removal Contract

BACKGROUND: Over the last several years stump removal has been removed from the Department of Public Works budget due to limited funds. And, last year, the city executed a contract to remove over forty trees from the right-of-way due to poor condition. This situation has resulted in a large number of stumps remaining in the right-of-way throughout the city. At budgeting time for the current fiscal year, council fielded complaints about the unsightly stumps. At that time, council directed staff to budget \$36,000 for stump removal throughout the city.

The City spent the last several months gathering data on the stumps so the bids could be issued. On December 15, 2021 staff received six bids with the following results:

RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE DEVELOPMENT PLAN AND TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PLAN OF THE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT FINANCE AUTHORITY

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE:

 Amendment to LDFA Plan to add construction and financing of an electric substation.

WHEREAS, the City of Marshall, County of Calhoun, State of Michigan (the "City") previously established the Local Development Finance Authority of the City of Marshall (the "Authority") under the provisions of Act No. 281, Public Acts of Michigan, 1986 ("Act 281"); and

WHEREAS, Act 281 was repealed and replaced by the Recodified Tax Increment Financing Act, Act No. 57, Public Acts of Michigan, 2018 ("Act 57"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Development Plan, as amended (the "Development Plan") and a Tax Increment Financing Plan, as amended (the "Tax Increment Financing Plan") pursuant to which the Authority has financed infrastructure and other public facilities in the Authority's development area; and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to acquire and construct additional public facilities (as defined in Part 4 of Act 57) comprised of an electric substation, and other public facilities, in the Authority's development area, together with any appurtenances and attachments thereto and any related site improvements (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to finance the Project through the issuance of tax increment revenue bonds, and to repay the bonds from tax increment revenues collected under the Tax Increment Financing Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has prepared the Plan Amendments presented herewith (the "Plan Amendments") in order to add construction and financing of the Project and to extend the term of the Development Plan and Tax Increment Financing Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has given the taxing jurisdictions levying taxes subject to capture an opportunity to meet with the City Council and to express their views and recommendations regarding the Plan Amendments; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on the Plan Amendments as required by Part 4 of Act 57.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. <u>Public Purpose</u>. The City Council hereby determines that the Development Plan and Tax Increment Financing Plan as amended by the Plan Amendments constitutes a public purpose.
- 2. Review of Plans. As required by Part 4 of Act 57, the City Council has taken the following considerations into account in reviewing the Development Plan and Tax Increment Financing Plan as amended by the Plan Amendments:

- (a) The Development Plan meets the requirements set forth in Section 415(2) of Part 4 of Act 57, and the Tax Increment Financing Plan meets the requirements of Part 4 of Act 57 as set forth in section 412(1), (2) and (3).
- (b) The proposed method of financing the public facilities is feasible and the Authority has the ability to arrange the financing.
- (c) The development is reasonable and necessary to carry out the purposes of Part 4 of Act 57.
- (d) The estimate of the Captured Assessed Value (as defined in Part 4 of Act 57) to result from adoption of the amendments to the Development Plan and Tax Increment Financing Plan is reasonable.
- (e) The land to be acquired under the Development Plan, if any, is reasonably necessary to carry out the purposes of the Development Plan and the purposes of Part 4 of Act 57.
- (f) The Development Plan is in reasonable accord with the approved master plan of the City.
- (g) Public services, such as fire and police protection and utilities, are or will be adequate to service the property described in the Development Plan.
- (h) Changes in zoning, streets, street levels, intersections, and utilities, to the extent required by the Development Plan, are reasonably necessary for the Project and for the City.
- 3. Approval and Adoption of Plan Amendments. The City Council hereby approves and adopts the Plan Amendments as submitted by the Authority. The City Clerk is hereby directed to make and preserve a record of the public hearing, including all data presented at the public hearing, and to maintain on file in the City Clerk's office a copy of the Development Plan and Tax Increment Financing Plan as amended by the Plan Amendments.
- 4. <u>Recission</u>. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution are hereby rescinded.

PREAMBLE

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 2019-06, AS AMENDED, TO REPEAL THE CULTIVATION OF MARIHUANA IN HOOP HOUSES; TO AMEND SECTIONS "DEFINITIONS", "LOCATION AND ELIGIBILITY", AND "MARIHUANA CULTIVATION"; TO AMEND ANY SECTIONS INCONSISTENT WITH ORDINANCE NO. 2019-06, AS AMENDED; AND TO ESTABLISH AN EFFECTIVE DATE AS PROVIDED BY LAW.

The City of Marshall, Michigan Ordains:

§ 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend City Ordinance 2019-06, as amended, and the Code of Ordinances of the City of Marshall, Title XI Business

Regulations, Chapter 121, Commercial Marihuana, as amended, to repeal "Hoop Houses" and delete all such use reference thereto, and to prohibit such "Hoop House" use within the City limits of the City of Marshall and on any property that the City controls under an interlocal governmental agreement.

It is the intent of these provisions to provide for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Marshall that quality of life is not impaired, neighborhood character is preserved, commercial activities developed and increased, employment opportunities expanded, and positive planned land use developed.

- § 2. "HOOP HOUSES" REPEALED AND PROHIBITED. That all sections of Ordinance # 2019-06, as amended, and the Code of Ordinances of the City of Marshall, Title XI Business Regulations, Chapter 121, Commercial Marihuana, as amended, shall repeal "Hoop Houses" and all such "Hoop House" cultivation use and reference to, and to prohibit such "Hoop House" cultivation use within the City limits of the City of Marshall and on any property that the City controls under an interlocal governmental agreement.
- § 3. **DEFINTIONS.** That Ordinance # 2019-06, as amended, Section "DEFINITIONS" and the Code of Ordinances of the City of Marshall, Title XI Business Regulations, Chapter 121, Commercial Marihuana, as amended, is hereby amended to repeal "Hoop Houses" and such use to read as follows:

DEFINITIONS. Section "DEFINITIONS" is hereby amended and shall repeal and delete "Hoop Houses" as follows:

HOOP HOUSE. A temporary structure used exclusively for the production and storage of live plants, with no permanent anchoring system or foundation; no storage, temporary or otherwise, of solvents, fertilizers, gases or other chemicals or flammable materials; built according to manufacturer recommendations; no more than 18 feet maximum height. Notwithstanding this definition, Hoop Houses and such use are prohibited within the City limits of the City of Marshall and prohibited on any property that the City controls under an interlocal governmental agreement.

§ 4. LOCATION AND ELIGIBILITY. Section "LOCATION AND ELIGIBILITY" is hereby amended and shall repeal and delete "Hoop Houses" as follows:

- (D) Marihuana Establishment licenses permitted under this Ordinance are governed by type and location requirements, as follows:
 - (1) Marihuana Grower License:

- b. All grower establishments and operations must be within an enclosed, secured structure, and cultivation of marihuana may occur in an outdoor area confined to a "commercial greenhouse" or "hoop house" that must meet all the following conditions:
 - Comply with applicable state law, rules and regulations, and City ordinances and City Zoning Ordinance.
 - ii. Cultivation of marihuana in a commercial greenhouse or hoop house is only permitted and subject to a Special Land Use for special conditions (special land uses) in the identified Industrial District subject to the provisions of the City's Zoning Ordinance. A Special land Use permit may be revoked or rescinded by the City Council for violation of the Special Land Use permit, City ordinance, Zoning Ordinance, or state law and regulations, after notice to the permit holder and hearing.
 - hoop house must be concealed from public view and must be completely confined and enclosed in a commercial greenhouse or hoop house made of durable translucent material on all sides and top of a hoop house, or constructed of commercial grade building construction materials, that may include glass, glass-like or translucent material (but not plastic) on all sides

and top of a commercial greenhouse, as required under applicable building and construction codes. Hoop houses and Commercial greenhouses may not exceed 18 feet maximum height.

- iv. Commercial greenhouses and hoop houses must be located on the parcel of the licensed grower facility/establishment, fully enclosed by security fencing and barriers that block outside visibility of the commercial greenhouse, hoop house, and marihuana plants from the public view to accomplish complete screening from the road right-of-way and adjacent property. No marihuana plants may grow outside the top of the commercial greenhouse or hoop house and must not be visible above the fence and barrier that is visible to public view. Fencing must comply with the applicable security measures and fencing requirements under city ordinance and LARA/MRA rules, including but not limited to, locked entries only accessible to authorized persons or emergency personnel. Security fencing must be at a minimum of eight (8) feet in height.
- v. After the marihuana is harvested, all drying, trimming, curing, or packaging of marihuana must occur inside a permanent building meeting all the requirements of City ordinance, state statue, codes and LARA/MRA rules and regulations.
- vi. Commercial Greenhouses and hoop houses must meet the security requirements and pass the inspections in this ordinance and LARA/MRA rules and any required building and electrical permit pursuant to City ordinance, state statute and LARA/MRA rules.

- vii. Commercial greenhouses and hoop houses shall meet setback requirements of the City's Zoning Ordinance.
- viii. Odor Control. A grower or a processor shall install and maintain in operable condition a system which precludes the emission of unreasonable marihuana odor from the property.

 i. All buildings, commercial greenhouses, hoop houses, and structures shall be subject to inspection at any time by the City Fire Department to insure compliance with all applicable statutes, codes and ordinances.

- § 5. MARIHUANA CULTIVATION. Section "MARIHUANA CULTIVATION" is hereby amended and shall repeal and delete "Hoop Houses" as follows:
 - (A) Cultivation, generally.
 - (1) Marihuana cultivation shall be conducted consistent with this Ordinance, the MRTMA, including but not limited to MCL 333.27961, and any LARA rules, within an enclosed, secured structure, and as permitted in a commercial greenhouse or hoop house—under city ordinances and subject to a Special Land Use permit; and

§ 6. SEVERABILITY. It is the legislative intent of the City adopting this Ordinance that all provisions hereof shall be liberally construed to protect the public health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City and all other persons affected by this Ordinance. Consequently, should any provision of this Ordinance be held to be unconstitutional, invalid or of no effect, such holding shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or Zoning Code, it being the intent of the City Council that this Ordinance shall stand and remain in effect, notwithstanding the invalidity of any provision thereof.

CONFLICTING ORDINANCE AND CODE PROVISIONS REPEALED. Any § 7. City of Marshall Ordinance, parts of Ordinances, or any Marshall Code provision in conflict or inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and is hereby repealed, and

all other provisions of the Marshall Ordinances shall remain in full force and effect.

§ 8. SAVINGS. All proceedings pending and all rights and liabilities existing, acquired or incurred at the time this Ordinance takes effect are saved and may be consummated according

to the law in force when they were commenced.

PUBLICATION. This Ordinance [or a summary thereof as permitted by MCL § 9. 125.3401] shall be published in the *Marshall Advisor*, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Marshall qualified under state law to publish legal notices. This Ordinance shall be recorded in the Ordinance Book and such recording shall be authenticated by the signatures of

the Mayor and the City Clerk.

§ 10. CODE EDITS. That the editors of the Marshall Zoning Code are hereby authorized to

update and revise the Marshall Zoning Code to effectuate the provisions of this Ordinance.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance is declared to be effective seven (7) days after publication or as provided by law.

ORDINANCE #2021-10

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF MARSHALL ZONING CODE, TO REPEAL CERTAIN SECTIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 2020-14; TO AMEND CHAPTER 2.0, DEFINITIONS, SECTION 2.2, AND CHAPTER 4.0 USE STANDARDS, SECTION 4.16, COMMERCIAL GREENHOUSES, NURSERIES AND GARDEN CENTERS. REPEAL ANY ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREOF; AND TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

THE CITY OF MARSHALL, CALHOUN COUNTY, HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend the City Zoning Ordinance and Ordinance No. 2020-14 to repeal "Hoop Houses" and delete all such use reference thereto, and to prohibit such "Hoop House" use within the City limits of the City of Marshall and on property that the City controls under an interlocal governmental agreement.

It is the intent of this Ordinance to provide for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Marshall so that quality of life is not impaired, neighborhood character is preserved, and positive planned land use developed.

Section 2. "Hoop House" and Hoop House Use Repealed; Hoop Houses Prohibited. The City Zoning Ordinance and its amending ordinances are hereby and shall be amended to repeal "Hoop Houses" and to prohibit such "Hoop House" use within the City limits of the City of Marshall and on property that the City controls under an interlocal governmental agreement.

Section 3. That Chapter 2.0, Definitions of the Marshall City Zoning Code, Section 2.2 "Definitions", is hereby and shall be amended as follows:

Hoop House. A temporary structure used exclusively for the production and storage of live plants, with no permanent anchoring system or foundation; no storage, temporary or otherwise, of solvents, fertilizers, gases or other chemicals or flammable materials; built according to manufacturer recommendations; no more than 18 feet maximum height. Notwithstanding this definition, Hoop Houses and such use are prohibited within the City limits of the City of Marshall and prohibited on property that the City controls under an interlocal governmental agreement.

Section 4. That Chapter 3.0, Zoning Districts of the Marshall City Zoning Code, Section 3.1.12 "I-1 Research and Technical District", is hereby and shall be amended to delete "hoop houses" from Chapter 3.0, Zoning Districts of the Marshall City Zoning Code, Section 3.1.12 "I-1 Research and Technical District" as follows:

v. Commercial greenhouses, hoop houses, nurseries, and garden centers.

Section 5. That Chapter 4.0 Use Standards of the Marshall City Zoning Code, Section 4.16 "Commercial Greenhouses, Nurseries and Garden Centers", is hereby and shall be amended to delete "Hoop Houses" and such use and reference from Chapter 4.0 Use Standards of the Marshall City Zoning Code, Section 4.16 as follows:

Hoop Houses and Commercial Greenhouses for marihuana cultivation are permitted as special land uses in the I-1 district with no limits on square footage.

- 1. Hoop House. The following shall apply:
 - A. Setbacks shall be 1500 feet from any residential structure, 250 feet from the road right-of-way centerline, and 50 feet from any rear or side property line.
 - B. Limited duration not to exceed three (3) years.
 - C. If a Hoop House contains any device subject to the electrical code or any mechanical equipment subject to the mechanical code, a permit shall be required for the device, system or fixture only. If the hoop house is connected to a potable water system, a permit shall be required for the backflow prevention devices only.
- 2. Commercial Greenhouse. The following shall apply:
 - A. Setbacks shall be required under Section 3.1.12(D).
- 3. Hoop House and Commercial Greenhouse cultivation of marihuana. The following shall apply:
- A. Comply with applicable LARA/MRA rules and regulations, City ordinances and City Zoning Ordinance.
- B. Subject to a Special Land Use permit under Section 6.2, permit and for special conditions as may be necessary based upon the uniqueness of the property, subject to a public hearing, review and recommendation by the Planning Commission, and approval by the City Council in accordance with the procedures and conditions specified in Section 6.2. of the Zoning Ordinance. A Special land Use permit may be revoked or rescinded by the City Council for violation of the SUP, City ordinance, Zoning Ordinance, or state law and regulations, after notice to the SUP holder and hearing.
- C. As permitted in this section, the area containing the cultivation of marihuana plants must be completely confined and enclosed in a Hoop House or Commercial Greenhouse made of durable construction to include metal framing materials and durable translucent material on all sides and top of a Hoop House, or glass, building materials that may include glass-like or translucent material on all sides and top of a

Commercial Greenhouses. Hoop Houses and Commercial Greenhouses may not exceed 18 feet maximum height.

- D. Hoop Houses and Commercial Greenhouses must be located on the parcel of the grower establishment or facility, fully enclosed by property security fencing. Security fencing must be at a minimum of eight (8) feet in height.
- E. Site Plan approval. Hoop Houses and Commercial Greenhouses are subject to site plan review and must receive approval.
- F. Screening shall comply with Section 5.15.8, and also include the means, including walls and plantings, to accomplish complete visual screening from the road right-of-way and adjacent property. Hoop Houses and Commercial Greenhouses must have greenbelt barriers that block outside visibility of the marihuana plants from the public view, with no marihuana plants growing outside the top of the Hoop House or Commercial Greenhouse nor above the fence and barrier that is visible to the public eye and the fences must be secured and comply with the applicable security measures in City ordinances and LARA/MRA rules and regulations, including but not limited to, locked entries only accessible to authorized persons or emergency personnel.
- G. After the marihuana is harvested, all drying, trimming, curing, or packaging of marihuana must occur inside a permanent building meeting all the requirements of City ordinance, state statue, codes and LARA/MRA rules and regulations.
- H. Hoop Houses and Commercial Greenhouses must meet the security requirements and pass inspections required under City ordinance and LARA/MRA rules and regulations and any necessary building permit pursuant to City ordinance, state statute, code and LARA/MRA rules and regulations.
- Odor Control. A grower or a processor shall install and maintain in operable condition a system which precludes the emission of unreasonable marihuana odor from the property.

Section 6. Severability. It is the legislative intent of the City adopting this Ordinance that all provisions hereof shall be liberally construed to protect the public health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City and all other persons affected by this Ordinance. Consequently, should any provision of this Ordinance be held to be unconstitutional, invalid or of no effect, such holding shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or Zoning Code, it being the intent of the City Council that this Ordinance shall stand and remain in effect, notwithstanding the invalidity of any provision thereof.

Section 7. Conflicting Ordinance and Code Provisions Repealed. Any City of Marshall Ordinance, parts of Ordinances, or any Marshall Code provision in conflict or inconsistent with

any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and is hereby repealed, and all other provisions of the Marshall Zoning Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 8. Savings. All proceedings pending and all rights and liabilities existing, acquired or incurred at the time this Ordinance takes effect are saved and may be consummated according to the law in force when they were commenced.

Section 9. Publication. This Ordinance [or a summary thereof as permitted by MCL 125.3401] shall be published in the *Marshall Advisor*, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Marshall qualified under state law to publish legal notices. Green Street to Lincoln Street, North on Lincoln Street to Michigan Avenue. (Note: Mansion Street will not be used as a detour route, as the event uses Mansion Street for a portion of the event course).

There will be numerous intermittent lane and road closures on several other local roads over the course of the event.

EVENT DETAIL: An Oaklawn led group will escort lead runners. 5K race route starts south on North Kalamazoo Avenue between Michigan Avenue and Prospect Street, then east on Michigan Avenue to Mansion Street, then west on Mansion Street to Linden Street, then north on Linden Street to Kalamazoo Avenue, then south on Kalamazoo Avenue to the finish line in front of the Honolulu House.

The one-mile race route starts south on North Kalamazoo Avenue between Michigan Avenue and Prospect Street, then east on Michigan Avenue to Gordon Street, then north on Gordon Street to Mansion Street, then west on Mansion Street to Grand Street, then north on Grand Street to Prospect, then west on Prospect Street to Kalamazoo Avenue, then south on Kalamazoo Avenue to the finish line in front of the Honolulu House.

ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES: In addition to the running races, Oaklawn Hospital will be setting up a variety of family friendly activities within the Fountain Circle Park during the event. Oaklawn will be responsible for setup and clean up. They plan to be cleaned up and out of the area by 3 pm.

MARRATIVE: This event has been a part of the Community for 38 years, and has grown into a well-attended event. The event has always been well run, adequately staffed and professionally organized.

One issue that cannot be determined yet is if the Governor's Office will allow for such gatherings at the time of the event. Oaklawn, as a healthcare provider is well aware of this, and understands any approval of this activity will be contingent on the health mandates and orders in place at that time. As they did in 2020, they will not run the event if there are any prohibiting mandates still in place, or if there are risks to the public health.

FISCAL EFFECTS: The event will incur costs for several City Departments (Police and Fire \$2495.84- Planning, Traffic Control and Emergency Services), (City Administration- \$18 Filing) and (Streets \$1408.47- MDOT Permit, Scheduling, Barricade Placement, Detour Routes). This is cost estimated at \$3922.31. These costs can either be waived by Council, or can be assessed to the event sponsor by the City Clerk prior to the event.

RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that City Council approve the Event and required street closures as presented, contingent on if the health mandates and orders in effect at the time of the event allow for it.

It is also recommended that as the event will be on City roads, and on City owned property, a certificate of proof of liability coverage insurance with coverage amounts/requirements to be determined by the City Attorney, and with City of Marshall named as co-insured, be obtained from the event sponsor.

BACKGROUND: The City of Marshall plans to construct the new Brooks Substation, a 138kV to 12.47kV distribution substation, in 2022 at 11301 Old US-27 South to increase electric distribution system power delivery capacity and improve electric system reliability. On December 22, 2021, bids were opened for the following Brooks Substation transformers and related substation equipment:

- 138kV to 12.47kV 20/27/33 MVA Power Transformers
- 138kV Circuit Switchers
- 138kV Metering Units
- 138kV Vee Break Switches
- 15kV Breakers (1,200 Amp and 2,000 Amp ratings)
- 15kV Hook-Stick Switches (1,200 Amp and 2,000 Amp ratings)
- 15kV Tandem Switches

The bid item, low bidder, bid amount(s), delivery time and warrant information are included in the table below. More detailed information regarding the bids is included in the attached bid tabulations and letters of recommendation from the City's consulting engineers, GRP Group.

GRP Engineering, Inc. has completed reviewing transformer procurement bids submitted on December 22, 2021 for the Brooks Substation Project. Of the five manufacturers solicited for bids, three (3) bids were received. Virginia Transformer had the lowest base bid price in the amount of \$2,090,218.00. As requested in the bid documents, Virginia Transformer provided the cost for one spare high voltage bushing and one spare low voltage bushing at a cost of \$10,000.00 for the pair. The total cost of the power transformers and spare bushings is \$2,100,218.00. Virginia Transformer also had the lowest total evaluated cost of ownership for the power transformers in the amount of \$2,222,797.00. The complete bid tabulations are attached to this letter.

Lead time for the power transformers is 30-32 weeks after order acknowledgment, with an anticipated delivery of August 10, 2022. All of the manufacturers included their own terms and conditions with the purchase. Virginia Transformer's are listed on Page 11 of their proposal and are limited in comparison to the other manufacturers. GRP Engineering, Inc. sees no reason not to accept Virginia Transformer's bid in the full amount of \$2,100,218.00 for the Brooks Substation Project.

SUBJECT: 2022 Water/Sewer Rates

BACKGROUND: In November 2021, with the assistance of Mr. Mike Engels of the Michigan Rural Water Association (MRWA), the City analyzed water and sewer rates. The analysis of rates is completed to ensure revenue requirements, to maintain the water and sewer services in a sustainable condition, are met. It is critical that utility systems will serve the present needs and will continue to meet future needs of the City of Marshall's service area. Components considered when reviewing rates include the following:

- Daily Operation and Maintenance (O&M) Expenses
- Replacement expenses of operating equipment
- Capital improvement costs
- Administrative expenses
- Debt Service requirements
- State and Federal regulatory requirements

In January 2021, staff recommended adjusting rates for one year. The recommendation this year is a constant rate increase for the next two years. State and Federal regulations, while always in discussion, are expected to maintain status quo since the establishment of the Lead and Copper Rule. The fiscal effects of Covid-19, a large concern last year, have played out and staff were able to adjust for those in these rates. Two years allows for efficiency should no large operational or capital plans significantly change, however, we can always re-visit rates next year. In fact, staff will complete a review of the rate study in fall of 2022 as good practice to ensure the departments are maintaining fiscal responsibility.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that City Council approve the attached water/sewer rate fee schedules for implementation on February 1, 2022.

Water and Wastewater Rates Effective Date: February 1, 2022 Marguerite Davenport Director of Public Services January 5, 2022

At the regularly held City Council meeting on January 3, 2022, City Council approved water and wastewater utility rate increases to the amounts summarized below. The rates will be effective on February 1, 2022. Water and wastewater rates are reviewed annually by City Staff and recommendations made to council to adjust rates so that utility funds remain financially sustainable. When the departments review rates, five major expense categories are assessed: operations and maintenance, equipment replacement, capital expenses, administration, and debt. Water and wastewater rates are structured with two charges: readiness to serve and commodity charge. Increases were approved for both charge types. These rate changes apply to Chapter 53, sections 53.01 and 53.02 of the City of Marshall Code of Ordinances.

The rate increases were approved for the next two years at a constant rate. Water rates will increase 3.0% and wastewater rates will increase 1.5%. The rate increases are par or below with inflation and necessary to maintain the utilities in proper working condition. City staff recommended the rate increase over a two-year period with anticipation that a majority of regulatory requirements have been established. As a best practice staff review rates annually and any adjustments needed in a year will be presented to City Council.

The City of Marshall Water and Wastewater departments are committed to providing water and wastewater services to the City with community health, environmental health, and fiscal responsibility at the forefront of our daily operations.

SUBJECT: Deputy Chief Position for the Police Department

BACKGROUND:

MARSHALL POLICE DEPARTMENT COMMAND STRUCTURE AND STAFFING:

Historically, the Marshall Police Department has had two administrative positions. These positions have typically consisted of a Chief/Director and a Deputy Chief. Currently we have a public safety director model with a director overseeing and both the police and fire departments and supervising the Fire and Police Chief's.

With my promotion to Police Chief and the hiring of Martin Erskine as our Fire Chief, the structure is set to return to a Fire Chief and Police Chief model of command with the retirement of Director McDonald. This will leave the police department short of a command officer. We currently have 15 sworn positions which provides 24/7 coverage with a minimum of at least two officers working each shift.

DEPUTY CHIEF OF POLICE:

In the past, the Police Chief has always had a non-union Deputy Chief position in the Police Department. With the retirement of Director McDonald, there is a need for a Deputy Chief to maintain the same level of administrative oversight within the Police Department.

Over the last three years we lost an administrative position. Three years ago, we had 2 ½ administrators which included a Director, Deputy Chief and Lieutenant. With the promotion of Director McDonald from Deputy Chief and my promotion to Police Chief from Lieutenant, the Lieutenant position was left vacant. This left us with, 1 ½ administrative positions, a Director and a Chief. During this time, the sergeant's union removed the Lieutenant position from their contract language.

The loss of this administrative position and the added administrative duties was a burden for the department in 2020. In response, this last January we created an administrative sergeant assignment to expose our sergeants to administrative duties and help with day-to-day administrative tasks. This helped us fill some of our administrative gaps with the accreditation and LEIN requirements. The assignment, however, is not a full-time administrator as the sergeant is

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also filling schedule gaps as a road sergeant. The sergeant position is also a union position which is not suitable for some supervision and administrative functions.

One of the goals as Police Chief is to work with our community partners to help put systems in place to organize and plan police operations. We want to continue engaging the community and developing community partnerships to address community needs. These increased efforts by the Police Chief will take attention from operations and quality control. A Deputy Police Chief will be dedicated to the task of improving operations and maintaining the high-quality of standards that our citizens are accustomed to experiencing. The Deputy Chief will manage and supervise the sergeants while guiding our staff to improve the services we provide.

BUDGET/COSTS INFORMATION:

Deputy Chief-

- The suggested salary for the Deputy Chief is \$76,735.
- The Director salary is currently budgeted at \$85,700. With the retirement of Director McDonald, the remaining budget from the Director Salary will cover the salary of the Deputy Police Chief for this budget year. The Deputy Chief position will be added to the next budget.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that City Council approve a Deputy Police Chief Position and the recommended salary, along with the backfilling of budgeted positions if needed.

ALTERNATIVES: As suggested by Council.
