BACKGROUND: On October 21st, the Council approved a P.A. 425 Conditional Land Transfer with Marshall Township for 15325 West Michigan Avenue to enter into a Public Act 425 Conditional Land Transfer.

The Marshall Township Board requested a few minor amendments:

- The effective date be changed from date of sale to January 1, 2020.
- Corrected Contract Section 5A to 4 mills.
- Corrected Contract Section 5B from City to Township.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Council accept the amended PA 425 Land Transfer for land owned by the Michael-Samuel Corporation at 15325 West Michigan Avenue.

WHEREAS, the City and the Township have adopted a Master 425 Agreement dated June 24, 2019 for the purpose of providing utility services which are available in the City to Township properties upon the request of a Township property owner, and

WHEREAS, Michael-Samuel Corporation, the owner of the property described on Schedule 1 attached hereto ("Property") has requested that the City extend sewer and water services to the Property, and

WHEREAS, the provision of municipal services by the City to the Property would further the economic well-being of both the City and the Township and increase the probability of additional development of the Property, and

WHEREAS, the City has available utility capacity to service the Property, and

WHEREAS, the parties have each conducted a public hearing to receive input on the proposed transfer of property.

NOW, THEREFORE, by authority of Act 425 of Public Acts of 1984 and pursuant to the Master 425 Agreement entered into between the City and the Township and in consideration of the mutual promises herein set forth, BE IT AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Township consents to the transfer to the City of the Property.
- 2. The City agrees to accept the transfer of the Property for all purposes allowed under Public Act 425 of 1984, as amended, to make available municipal services to the Property provided that the Property owner and other users of the utilities extended from the City to the Property shall pay for the cost of the extension.
- 3. The transfer of the Property contemplated by this agreement shall occur at midnight on January 1, 2020.
- 4. Following transfer, and during the term of this Agreement, the City shall have full jurisdiction over the property subject to the following limitations:

Land usages shall be subject to the Joint Municipal Planning Commission pursuant to the provisions of the Master 425 Agreement.

5. The City and Township agree that the City shall have the authority to assess and collect ad valorem taxes, real and personal, on the Property and any improvements thereon during 2020 and for the remainder of the term of this Agreement. The Township shall have the authority to assess and collect ad valorem taxes, real and personal, on the Property and any improvements thereon through calendar year 2019.

The City and Township further agree that commencing in the year 2020 and continuing through the fiftieth (50th) full calendar year following the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy for the first use on the Property, all such taxes which the City collects for its own general operating fund purposes only, and which are attributable to the Property for the term of this Agreement shall be shared between the City and the Township as follows:

- A. The Township shall receive the equivalent of 4 mills levied on the taxable value of the Property for the taxable year as established by the City subject to any subsequent adjustments resulting from tax appeals. The City shall transmit the Township's share of such revenues annually on or before 30 days after receipt.
- B. Thereafter, all tax revenues from the Property shall be collected and retained by the Township.
- 6. Except as provided in paragraph 7, upon termination, expiration or non-renewal of this Agreement, jurisdiction of the Property shall return to the Township and the City will have no further rights or interests in the Property except that the City shall own the utility infrastructure.
- 7. In the event that the City shall not share tax revenues from the Property as provided in paragraph 5 or shall breach any other provision of this Agreement, the Township shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement, whereupon jurisdiction of the Property shall revert to the Township or the Township may pursue whatever other legal remedies are available to the Township.
- 8. Any liability the City or the Township incurs to a third party as a result of the performance of duties or the exercise or rights imposed or granted hereunder shall be jointly shared and defended in the same proportion as the taxes are shared as described in paragraph 5.
- 9. The burden of all tax abatements shall be shared by the City and the Township in the same percentage as the millage is shared.
- 10. Sewer and water rates charged to the Property owner shall not be greater than the rates charged in the City for similar users. Property owners shall contribute to repairs and capital improvements to the sewage treatment facilities, water purification plant, well facilities, and distribution systems in the same manner as similar users within the City of Marshall.
- 11. In the event there is a conflict between this Agreement and the Master 425 Development Agreement, the terms of the Master 425 Development Agreement shall

- control unless there is a specific reference in the conflicting provision that it is intended to prevail despite the Master 425 Development Agreement.
- 12. Within fifteen (15) days of execution of this contract, the City Clerk shall file a duplicate original of this contract with the Calhoun County Clerk, the Michigan Secretary of State and the Calhoun County Register of Deeds.

PUBLIC HEARINGS & SUBSEQUENT COUNCIL ACTION

A. Creation of South Neighborhood Improvement Authority:

Director of Special Projects Eric Zuzga explained the purpose of holding the public hearing. No action will be taken this evening for creating the district. The intent is to receive comment and there is a 60-day waiting period for City Council to receive further comments from residents and affected taxing jurisdictions.

Mayor Caron opened the public hearing to hear comment regarding the proposed creation of a South Neighborhood Improvement Authority.

Mike Murphy of 1001 S. Kalamazoo read a prepared statement for the record:

Mr. Mayor, Members of the City Council and City Administration, Thank you for the opportunity to briefly address the proposed South Neighborhood Improvement Authority for Marshall. As I mentioned at the last Council meeting on November 4, my family and I have resided in the district for more than 30 years and our sons are graduates of Marshall High School. The staff of both the schools and City of Marshall have always been courteous and helpful to us. We have found over time that both institutions are committed to the general welfare of everyone who resides within the City and the school districts. I am here this evening to express my support for the new South Neighborhood Improvement Authority. It seems to me that the City has already taken some positive steps in that direction by rezoning Alwyn Downs Golf Course for residential 2 development, and, of course, a private developer is already engaged. We can expect, however, that maintaining the public interest over the long term, upon which the success or failure of the new Authority will depend, will require timely recognition, respect, and accommodation of competing goals and objectives; prudent and feasible planning; and willingness to consider alternatives and compromise where needed. I have every confidence in the City of Marshall, and with these things in mind, I am sure the new Authority will prove to be a great success for everyone concerned.

SUBJECT: Solid Waste Disposal Ordinance

BACKGROUND: The adopted Council Goals and Vision stated that issues surrounding trash, recycling, bulk/large item, and yard waste services should be explored. It is necessary to adopt a new ordinance to allow the City to move to a single hauler to provide these services. The attached ordinance was developed to include language permitting the issuance of an exclusive contract.

Based on a discussion with Chief McDonald, who is in the process of updating other sections of the Code of Ordinances, we are recommending the removal of sections 50.04, 50.12, 50.13, and the definition of garbage. These items are included in his update of other sections of the Code of Ordinances.

RECOMMENDATION: Council should hold the public hearing and then determine if adoption of the ordinance is the right step to take. If the ordinance is adopted, Council would then consider the proposals that were received for the provision of the aforementioned services on December 16, 2019.

FISCAL EFFECTS: There are no direct fiscal effects of adopting the ordinance. The ordinance does not require the City to adopt a single hauler, but rather allows it.

ALTERNATIVES: The City could leave the current ordinance in place and take no action on the proposed ordinance.

- D. "Recyclable materials" means refuse materials designated by the City Manager to be part of the City's recycling program and which are intended for transportation, processing and remanufacturing or reuse. Such items include, but are not limited to, the following: various grades of paper and cardboard, plastic bottles and jugs, glass, tin and aluminum containers and yard waste. Selection of the materials to be recycled will be at the discretion of the City Manager.
- E. "Refuse" means all manner of the same, including; but not limited to, ashes, rags, discarded clothing, discarded furniture, discarded appliances, tin cans, tin ware, bottles, broken glass, waste paper, motor vehicles or automobiles or trucks which are unlicensed and which are in inoperable condition, or motor vehicles which, although licensed, are abandoned, or motor vehicles which, although licensed, are dismantled, partly dismantled and/or in an inoperable condition and which remain in a dismantled, partly dismantled and/or in an inoperable condition for ninety days or more. The words "refuse," "trash," "rubbish," "litter," and "debris" shall be considered synonymous terms for the purposes of this chapter.
- F. "Residential refuse and residential garbage service" means service provided to premises having one and two-family residences, or multiple-family dwellings of less than four units.
- G. "Solid industrial waste service" means all trade wastes peculiar to industrial manufacturing or processing plants, including hazardous refuse, but not including commercial refuse
- H. "Yard waste" means leaves, grass clippings, weeds, hedge clippings, garden waste, twigs and brush no longer than two feet in length and one-half inch in diameter, and other organic material subject to natural composting as approved by the City Manager.

50.02 DISPOSAL OF REFUSE AND GARBAGE.

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to keep on or about premises owned or occupied by him or her any garbage, unless the same shall be kept in a watertight receptacle, which shall be kept tightly covered so as to prevent the access of insects or animals. The contents of such receptacles shall be removed

from the premises and properly disposed of at least once every seven days. However, if the owner of a premises occupied by a tenant or tenants shall furnish or cause to be furnished garbage pickup once every seven days for such tenant or tenants, such owner may not be prosecuted for violations of this section on such tenant-occupied premises during the period in which such garbage pickup was furnished.

- B. It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to dump, deposit, place, throw or leave, or cause or permit the dumping, depositing, throwing, or leaving of garbage or refuse on any private property within the City.
- C. No person shall burn any garbage or refuse.
- D. No person shall burn any substance which shall, due to the nature of the substance or manner of burning, create or constitute a nuisance.

50.03 DISPOSAL OF INDUSTRIAL WASTE.

It shall be unlawful for the owner of premises and the occupant thereof to permit or suffer the accumulation of industrial waste on any premises in the City. Industrial waste shall be stored in receptacles and disposed of properly. Items of solid industrial waste too large to be stored in such receptacles shall be neatly stacked and disposed of properly at least once every three months. It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly, without the consent of the owner of private property, to dump, deposit, place, throw or leave, or cause or permit the dumping, depositing, placing, throwing, or leaving of industrial waste on private land in the City. Liquid industrial waste shall be disposed of in accordance with applicable State and Federal regulations.

50.04 DEPOSITS ON PUBLIC GROUNDS.

No person shall throw or deposit any garbage or refuse on any of the public streets, sidewalks, lanes, alleys, parks, cemeteries or other public grounds in the City at any time, including, but not limited to, the deposit of household garbage or refuse in garbage, trash or refuse containers located on any public street, sidewalk, lane, alley, park, cemetery or other public grounds.

50.05 EXCLUSIVE CONTRACTS.

The City Council may, either by advertising for bids or otherwise, enter into an exclusive contract, with the mutual consent of the contractor, who shall be licensed, or extend the term of such contract, with such person as the City Council may deem best able to collect and dispose of residential refuse in the City in accordance with the best interests of the City and its residents. The contractor shall be the only person allowed to provide

residential refuse collection and disposal services within the City or within the boundaries prescribed by the limitations of this chapter. The contract documents shall contain provisions that the City contractor shall collect and dispose of refuse from all residential premises in the City in full compliance with this chapter and applicable local, State and Federal laws, rules, and regulations.

50.06 STORAGE OF CONTAINERS

From and after the passage and taking effect of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person to leave their containers along any public way, street, alley, sidewalk, or other public property. Containers used for the disposing of said trash and rubbish shall be kept on the property's side or rear yards, in garages, car ports, homes, or other structures not in open view in front yards. Containers can be placed adjacent to the road within a period of time 24 hours before to 12 hours after any collection by a licensed hauler for the residential home involved.

50.07 TYPES OF COLLECTION SERVICES.

The contractor shall provide either curbside unlimited or backyard collection service one time per week and curbside recycling services as defined by this chapter to each residential premises either one time per week, or bi-weekly as may be determined appropriate by the City Manager. Curbside refers to that portion of a right-of-way adjacent to paved or travelled City roadways, excluding approved alleys. Backyard refers to a side or backyard or place that is convenient for both the City contractor and the customer, but in no case shall the City contractor be required to enter a garage or dwelling.

Any yard waste set out subsequent to pick-up shall be removed from the curb lawn area within forty-eight hours by the owner, agent, or occupant of the premises in front of or adjacent to which the yard waste is located. Failure to remove improperly placed yard waste will result in the issuing of a Municipal civil infraction violation notice.
- D. The rules and regulations for the collection of yard waste will provide for the pickup of loose leaves.
- E. The yard waste pick-up program is not meant to circumvent the free-enterprise system of commercial lawn care companies. The City will not pick up yard waste generated by a commercial lawn care company.

50.13 DISPOSAL OF BRUSH; BRUSH PICK-UP PROGRAM.

A. No person shall place or deposit or cause to be placed or deposited, upon public or private property, brush, except as provided by this section.

Failure to remove improperly placed brush will result in the issuing of a Municipal civil infraction violation notice.
- D. The brush program is not meant to circumvent the free-enterprise system of commercial tree and brush removal. The City will not pick up material that is left as a result of a tree or lot being commercially cleared, removed, or pruned.

50.14 VACANT LOTS.

Any person owning or having a possessory interest in any lot or portion of land within the City which is vacant is responsible for securing, collecting and disposing of refuse which may accumulate thereon by contracting with a person licensed in accordance with this chapter or by self-removal through proper collection and storage of refuse, transporting the refuse in a manner to prevent littering or any other nuisance and depositing the same at an approved disposal area, in accordance with applicable local, State and Federal laws, rules and regulations.

50.15 ENFORCEMENT.

The City Manager or his/her appointee is hereby charged with enforcing this chapter.

50.99 Penalty

A person who violates any provision of this chapter is responsible for a Municipal Civil Infraction and shall be subject to the payment of a civil fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), plus costs and other sanctions, for each infraction, including any costs of clean-up. The City Council shall adopt a fine schedule for violations of this ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CITY OF MARSHALL ZONING CODE, CHAPTER 3.0 ZONING DISTRICTS SECTIONS 1.12.B AND 1.13.B THE CITY OF MARSHALL ORDAINS:

Section 1. That **Chapter 3.0, Zoning Districts** of the Marshall City Zoning Code, section 3.1.12, I-1 Research and Technical District, subsection B – Principal Permitted Uses, is hereby amended to **Add the following uses:**

 xxiv. "Any use allowed in such district as provided in the City Commercial Marihuana Ordinance."

Section 2. That **Chapter 3.0, Zoning Districts** of the Marshall City Zoning Code, section 3.1.13 I-2 General Industrial District, subsection B – Principal Permitted Uses, is hereby amended to **add the following uses:**

 xxv. "Any use allowed in such district as provided in the City Commercial Marihuana Ordinance."

Section 3. Severability. It is the legislative intent of the City adopting this Ordinance that all provisions hereof shall be liberally construed to protect the public health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City and all other persons affected by this Ordinance. Consequently, should any provision of this Ordinance be held to be unconstitutional, invalid or of no effect, such holding shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or Zoning Code, it being the intent of the City Council that this Ordinance shall stand and remain in effect, notwithstanding the invalidity of any provision hereof.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT December 3, 2019 – City Council Meeting

SUBJECT: Bids for Brooks Field Terminal Construction

BACKGROUND: In the spring of 2019, bids were received for the construction of an airport terminal building. The City received only two bids and were higher than expected. It was decided to rebid the project later in the year. Six bids were received on November 8th and the bid tabulation is attached. The Kalleward Group of Kalamazoo bid of \$921,000 was reduced by \$11,600 by the Airport Board by removing some items. The total for construction and construction administration is \$979,400.

The attached spreadsheet shows three options. The Airport receives a federal annual allotment of \$150,000. State MDOT allocates \$8,333/year, which the City matches. The City cannot save more than four years of allocations.

Based on these allocations, Option 1 requires the City to additionally allocate \$258,333 which would be a transfer from the general fund. Option 2 would request a \$100,000 loan from MDOT for ten years at an interest rate of 1% over prime. This option requires an additional City allocation of \$158,333. Option 3 would request a \$100,000 loan from MDOT for ten years at an interest rate of 1% over prime and borrowing one year's allocation from another municipal airport allocation, which we would reimbursement in 2021.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the City Council approve the bid from Kalleward Group of Kalamazoo for \$909,400 to construct the new Brooks Field Terminal and \$70,000 for Mead Hunts construction administration. It is further recommended that the project be funded by using the four years of available Federal and State funding, a loan of up to \$100,000 from the Michigan Department of Transportation, and borrow from another Airport's funding allocation to be paid in 2021 from the City's federal allocation. It is also recommended that the FY2020 budget for the Airport Capital Outlay account 295-900-970.00 be increased by \$20,470 (original budget is \$28,500)

SUBJECT: Major Material Purchases for the Pearl Street Electric

Substation Increase in Capacity Project.

BACKGROUND: The City Council approved the expediting of design for the Increase in Capacity Project (Project) for its Pearl Street 138/12.47kv Substation at its regular meeting on March 4, 2019. The City Council, subsequently, approved the purchase of a 30mva transformer at the low-bid price of \$818,000 for the Project at its regular meeting on July 15, 2019.

The City's Pearl Street Electric Substation provides electricity to approximately 90% of the City's current electric utility customers. The substation was constructed in 1982 with two 20MW transformers and has a current peak load on the station of 23MW. The two transformers were necessary to provide reliability in case one of the transformers must be taken out of service for an emergency or scheduled maintenance. An approximate 30MW of additional load is planned to be connected to the Pearl St. Substation within the next year caused mainly from new marijuana grow facilities.

A Request for Proposal was written and advertised/distributed on October 21, 2019 for additional major electrical equipment required for the Project with a bid opening of November 21, 2019.

The total conceptual cost for the project is \$2.5 million.

There are several major equipment purchases required for the substation that have long lead times which requires Council approval for authorization to requisition. The additional equipment is as follows:

A. Electric System Protection Relays and Associated Panels
